FRIENDS OF THE LIBRARY OCTOBER BOOK SALE 2024

The annual Fall Book Sale took place from **October 18–20, 2024**, in the lower level of Centennial Hall. Organized and conducted by volunteers and members of the Friends of the London Public Library, the sale was a tremendous success, with gross revenues exceeding **\$50,000**—an increase of \$7,000 compared to the 2023 sale. Net profits will be used to enhance London Public Library programs and activities, with a special focus on developing literacy skills.

Sale coordinators extend their thanks to several key contributors. Thanks to Campbell Bros. Movers and Yale Industrial Trucks (Alta Materials) for meeting transportation needs, and London Public Library staff for their assistance with advertising and signage. And of course, thank you to the many volunteers who worked tirelessly throughout the year to sort materials, set up sale tables on October 17, and ensure tables remained full and tidy during the sale. Your dedication and hard work are deeply appreciated.

A final recognition goes to the members of the community who generously donated books and other items for the sale and the Library store. While Library withdrawals make up a significant portion of the sale materials, community donations greatly enhance the quality of the sale, as reflected in both sale and store receipts.

A BOOK FOR EVERY CHILD

Over 7.000 books?

Yes, over 7,000 books were distributed to children in 2023 through the London Public Library's A Book for Every Child program. These books were provided to children who might not otherwise receive a new book of their own, thanks to the support of over 50 social agencies and schools. This success was made possible by the generous donations of new books and monetary contributions from individuals and groups.

Now in its **33rd year**, this vital Library program launched its targeted campaign on **November 4** and will continue until **December 20**. During this time, five participating bookstores are offering a **20% discount** on books purchased for the program. These books are left at the stores and picked up by Friends volunteers. SPEAKING WITH FRIENDS IN BLACK HISTORY MONTH

February is Black History Month, and the Friends of the Library are partnering with the London Black Heritage Council and the Library to present our first Speaking with Friends event since the pandemic lockdown.

The event, titled Black History: Thee New Books on the Southern Or tario Experience, will feature a panel discussion of three books that explore Black history in Court was terr Ontario:

- In the Light of Dawn by Marie Carter
- Blacks in a White Place by George Emery
- A Black American Missionary in Canada by Hilary Bates Neary

Join us on Thursday, February 20, 2025, from 6:30-8:30pm in the Stevenson & Hunt Room at the Central Library. The discussion will be moderated by Michael F. Murphy, with an introduction by Heather Rennalls and a summation by Nassisse Solomon.

Books will be available for purchase, courtesy of Oxford Books, and a reception will follow the panel discussion.

Celebrate Black History Month by deepening your understanding of the past and present experiences of Black citizens in Southwestern Ontario.
