The Friends have a great selection and great prices on Books, CD's, DVD's Books on CD, VHS tapes and Magazines for every age and interest.



We are seeking to fill the following volunteer positions:

- 1. Setup Staff who will unload and unpack sale material and help set up the tables.
- 2. General Floor Staff who will keep the tables organized and well stocked throughout the sale.
- 3. Information Desk Personnel who will sign in volunteers, certify student volunteer hours, and answer customer questions.
- 4. Cashiers who will process cash, credit, and debit payments.
- 5. Cashier Assistants who will help with cashier duties.
- 6. Clean up Staff who will assist with repacking and loading any unsold material.

Sign up to volunteer:

- 2. Review the options listed and choose the spot(s) you like.
- 3. Sign up It's easy, you will not need to register an account or keep a password on Signup.
